Jewell History Museum Improvements

The Jewell Historical Society has long been concerned about the stability and reliability of the Museum building's northeast door. This door provides a mode of egress from the building's lower level, and owing to its poor condition, there was some concern about its usefullness as an emergency means of escape. Thanks to Jason Seaton of local contractor *Seamless Pros*, this is no longer a concern. Through their help, JHS was able to acquire a new steel door and jamb, which Jason installed recently. Museum Additions

Thanks to the generosity of longtime Jewell resident Brooke Samuelson, the Museum now has an actual 1920 bank note from the first National Bank of Jewell Junction!

A national bank note is a form of United States currency issued by federally chartered national banks. These banks were encouraged to purchase U.S. bonds, with the notes they issued being backed by these bonds.

Such notes with charter #5743 belong to The First National Bank of Jewell Junction, Iowa, which is part of a registry of Iowa's national bank notes which details the charter numbers and towns associated with them.

Open House at new Casey's General Store

Today and tomorrow, Friday and Saturday, will see the grand opening of Jewell's newest business establishment, Casey's General Store.

Manager Rex Cook invites everybody in the South Hamilton area to come in and look over the store and enjoy a cup of coffee. The store hours are 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. every day.

Customers can receive five gallons of gasoline free with a minimum five gallon purchase, and may register for four big prizes to be given away. The first prize will be an 8 track home entertainment center; second prize an 8 track car stereo; third prize a 5 speed blender;

and fourth prize a decorator wall clock. The drawing will be held Sunday, October 15, at 1:00 p.m. and no purchase is necessary in order to register for the big drawing.

In addition to the opportunity to win one of the four big prizes, Manager Cook says that free ice cream will be served both days of the Casey's grand opening, as well as free balloons and free pizza samples.

A Blast from the Past

The following is a brief excerpt from the Jewell Quasquicentennial Book (p. 207 – 208), published in 2006. It has been slightly edited to fit the available space. This book and the Centennial Book (published in 1981) are available for review in the Jewell History Museum. In addition, copies can be found at the Montgomery Memorial Library, from where they can also be checked out by Library cardholders.

Jewell; United States Post Office

The Jewell Post Office has served the community of Jewell since December 27, 1880, according to the records at the National Archives in Washington, D. C....

The first Jewell Post Office was established south of the Jewell Junction depot. Later it was in the old State Bank building. It has also been located on King Street and Main Street in two locations. Today the Post Office is located at 549 Main St., at the intersection of Highways 175 and 69. It was completed about 1950. The Post Office building is owned by the E. W. Montgomery Trust.

When the first Post Office was established, Jewell had approximately 60 residents. Now, it serves approximately 2,500 rural and community residents....



The current employees at the Jewell Post Office are Eileen McLuckie, Postmaster, Beverly Grove, part-time clerk, plus John Schlafke and Russell Hockman, rural carriers. Spencer Hill and Vern Schwartz are substitute rural carriers.
